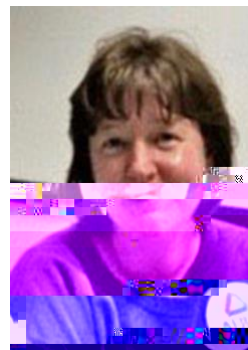
Dr. Daniel Cruz-Ramirez de Arellano
